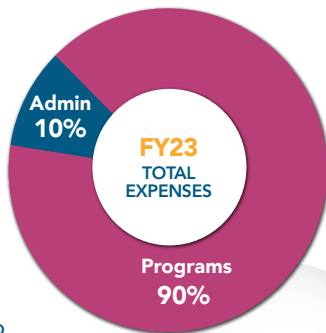
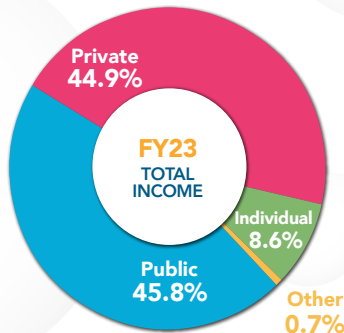

FY23 IN REVIEW

Fiscal year 2023 saw expansion for Arts Every Day. We added two new full-time staff members including a dedicated accountant, moved to a new and larger office space located at Baltimore Unity Hall, and conducted our 5 year strategic planning process with staff and the Board of Directors.

We secured new sources of funding and restructured some internal HR, protocol, and data keeping policies to ensure that all of our programs can run smoothly by a fully supported staff.

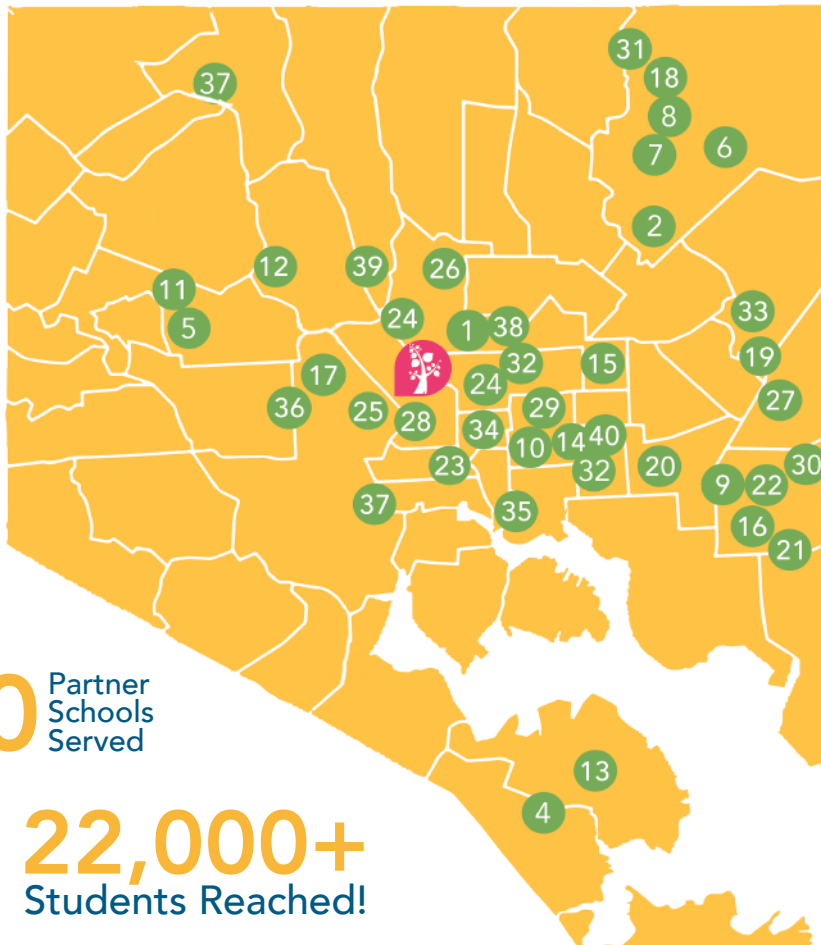
2022-23 SCHOOL YEAR

SCHOOLS PROGRAMS

In August 2022, AED adapted our annual summer conference into a hybrid format with both in-person and virtual options to better meet teacher's needs and honor their busy summer schedules. With the ability to earn AU credit, this flexible professional development structure was an attractive option for teachers looking to expand their understanding and practice of arts integration. Teachers had a wide variety of art forms to explore through the studio sessions and video course which showcased Arts Every Day's impressive network of Arts and Cultural Partners. Teachers sang songs to tell stories, created zines to talk about social studies, and discovered engineering through paper folding. From exploring math concepts used in rhythm through music and movement to theater skills used to enhance reading comprehension, teachers were able to walk away from the Summer Conference with fresh ideas and techniques to bring back to their classrooms.

BALTIMORE ARTS INTEGRATION PROJECT

As the Baltimore Arts Integration Project (BAIP) rounds out its second year of operation, we are grateful for the teaching artists, classroom teaching specialists, and panel of advisors who devoted their time and passion to making the project a success.

Our creative teams devoted many hours to crafting and filming arts-integrated asynchronous courses tailored to Baltimore City English/Language arts curriculum. The result is a growing library of arts-integrated professional development opportunities infused with the Brain-Targeted Teaching Model®, and is open to all City Schools teachers.

In preparation for School Year 2023-24, we welcomed our second cohort of BAIP teaching artists and teachers in June. We once again hosted a two-week intensive training conference on Brain-Targeted Teaching this year with an arts-integration focus on science through the lens of City Schools' science curriculum. During these two weeks, we focused on plant and animal classifications, genetic traits, the science of sound, and so much more. With the Cylburn Arboretum as our temporary home, our creativity was sparked by the connections between art, the natural world, and teaching!

BALTIMORE ARTS EDUCATION INITIATIVE

In 2018, Baltimore City Public Schools adopted a Fine Arts Strategic Plan developed by over 100 individuals convened by Arts Every Day. We are proud to sustain this community organizing effort by facilitating an advisory committee and issue-specific committees that work in partnership with district leaders to advance equitable access to the arts. Because of these efforts, the district has added more than 100 certified fine arts teaching positions and significantly increased investment in the arts over the past 5 years. Arts Every Day is grateful to all of the educators, parents, students, higher education faculty, philanthropic, and City leaders who dedicate hours of work each year to find and propose solutions to systemic barriers.

PARENT LEADERS

Baltimore City parents are tremendous leaders and advocates for their children. This year, Arts Every Day worked with parent leaders, Ysem Brown and Kadija Hart, to convene parents and community members to share practical steps for advocating for the arts in their neighborhood schools.

"I began to realize that the math I was doing in the band was the same kind of math that we were learning in Miss Jackson's class. 1 dotted half note equals 3 beats, and if 2 dotted half notes were put together then it will equal 6 beats. Note values help musicians keep their rhythm.

YOUTH ADVOCACY

The B'more Youth Arts Advocacy Council (BYAAC) is composed of eight Baltimore City youth creatives in grades 10 - 12 who attend Baltimore City Public Schools (BCPSS). BYAAC met twice a week from September 2022 - June 2023 to discuss arts education access and how to impact school decision-making while developing their leadership and public speaking skills.

Building on the work of the previous cohort, this year's group continued to raise public awareness about the benefits of an arts education, identified barriers to equitable access to the arts, and reached potential allies who would be in support of policies that make the arts accessible to every student in every school. The cohort testified to Maryland General Assembly in Annapolis, presented at Maryland Arts Day, and co-hosted the BCPSS Arts Education Town Hall with CEO Dr. Santelises.

In 2023, Arts Every Day awarded three Baltimore City Public Schools funding to implement large scale arts installations and collaborations that will have a long-term impact on their students and surrounding communities. This year's projects include outdoor learning space with Francis Scott Key Elementary Middle School in collaboration with mural artist SolRaya Public Space, a community mural with Roland Park Elementary Middle School who is partnering with artist LaToya Peoples, and Elmer A. Henderson: A Johns Hopkins Partnership School's ground plane mural project together with artist Jordan Lawson.

The Arts Every Day Public Art Grant for Baltimore City Public Schools is the only grant exclusively for Baltimore City Public Schools with the intention of supporting large scale, permanently installed projects that connect individual schools to local artists or organizations and their school community. These projects serve as a source of pride for students and foster an appreciation for the arts in Baltimore City.

For the 2022-23 school year, the Arts Equipment Fund has continued to assist in purchasing the equipment and instruments needed for high quality fine arts instruction. Most school budgets only cover enough for basic consumable supplies, leaving arts teachers to fundraise or even pay out of pocket. Unfortunately, some schools don't even cover that, leaving the teachers responsible for even the most basic supplies.

The Arts Equipment Fund is open to schools district-wide, with a priority for Title 1 schools. Teachers can submit up to \$5,000 equipment request lists that fit their school's specific needs. Arts Every Day purchases the items that are shipped directly to the school. From ballet barres and bass drums to costumes and cameras, the Arts Equipment Fund broadens the horizons of creativity for art, music, theater and dance classrooms across the city.

10X10 EXHIBIT

Arts Every Day believes in the power of art to build community, provide an avenue for youth expression, and introduce new concepts and ways of learning in the classroom. We do this each year through our annual exhibits. The 10X10 Exhibit & Youth Curatorial Program celebrates & elevates voices of Baltimore City students and teachers. These exhibits engage students in conversation, reflection, and creation while connecting them to local artists and institutions. Each year, the theme or inspiration artist sets the tone for works of art from how teachers approach the topics in the classroom to what medium or method is used to create the works. Last year's theme was UNITY- paying homage to our move to Baltimore Unity Hall.

The Youth Curatorial Program offers a paid opportunity to experience a GLAM (galleries, libraries, archives, and museums) field for high school students by breaking down boundaries that have traditionally excluded historically underrepresented communities.

COURTING ART BALTIMORE

Courting Art Baltimore held its awards reception awarding \$20,000 in College Bound Scholarships and honoring the 20 finalists out of a record 137 entries for this year's contest. An additional \$1,600 in giftcards to Artist & Craftsman was also given out to all the finalists and their teachers. This year, Courting Art Baltimore, under the direction of Brian Katzenberg and Senior Judge, Halee Weinstein in partnership with Arts Every Day and Baltimore City Public Schools Office of Fine Arts, broke records in the number of entries received; opening the door for an all-star jury panel to assist with narrowing down the list and choosing the top winners.

Courting Art Baltimore has awarded \$130,931 in College Bound Scholarships since it first began in 2016. In its 8th year, Courting Art continues to live true to its mission- connecting the legal community to the local community and bringing about peace through creativity for all who walk the halls of the Eastside District Court House.
