Question Stem

- Given the option of two exit tickets (on different colored paper), students had to pick one that they would come up with the answer choices for.
- This helps gauge where the students were in terms of coming up with answer choices, and which one they pick serves as indicator of their comfort level with the topic. Then some of the best responses could be used as warm-up questions or quiz items.

- What is something you weren't sure about at the start of the lesson but understand now?


Response Paddles


Ready Made Exit Tickets
